#### Costs

QUT Faculty of Law will cover the venue hire so there will be **no registration fee**.

The Faculty will also provide partial funding to cater for lunches and we will look around for a low cost dinner venue for the Saturday night. In keeping with long established TJ tradition we will organise karaoke for after dinner on Saturday for those who want to participate.

There are quite a few low cost accommodation options not far from QUT, which we will link to via the symposium thread on the ISTJ forum.

We encourage attendees to use the Oceania forum to organise group bookings via Airbnb.
